Dear sisters and brothers,

Re: Day of Prayer and Fasting for Ukraine and World Peace Wednesday, 2nd March, 2022

Grace and peace, I hope this note finds you well.

In light of recent events Pope Francis has announced 2nd March 2022, Ash Wednesday, as a Day of Fasting and Prayer for Ukraine.

In his recent General Audience, Pope Francis encouraged "believers in a special way to dedicate themselves intensely to prayer and fasting on that day. May the Queen of Peace preserve the world from the madness of war."

In my correspondence 28th January 2022, I attached a letter of appeal from the Ukranian Church of Australia. I draw your attention to the section "What can we do?" which outline ways we can be actively involved:

1. **Pray:** Continued prayer for peace in ther region.

2. Be Informed: Inform yourself about the situation so you can converse with others.

We should not look away.

3. Support: Support humanitarian efforts in the region including the work of

Caritas.

I ask that you inform your communities of this request and commit to this Day of Prayer and Fasting for Ukraine and World Peace, and I have included a message from Pope Francis encouraging us to pray and fast on this day.

We continue to offer our prayers and support to the Ukranian Catholic Church here in Australia.

APPEAL
