Migrant and Refugee Sunday 2021

The Archdiocese of Adelaide celebrated the 107th World Day of Migrants and Refugees with a solemn Multicultural Mass at St Francis Xavier Cathedral at 2.30pm, on Sunday 26 September. The theme chosen by Pope Francis for the celebration is "Towards an Ever Wider We". The Mass was organised as a livestream Mass with strict compliance to the government Covid19 regulations.

Archbishop Patrick O'Regan DD was the main celebrant with around twenty priests and deacons, including chaplains of cultural communities, concelebrating the Mass. It was indeed a very special day for the participants, with the sun shining, the church filled to capacity, as well as 180 viewing the live-stream from the comfort of home.

The congregation was made up of people from many cultures; some came in their national costumes, others in spirit, representing the faith they have brought to Adelaide to make up our diverse and beautiful church. People gathered on this special occasion to pray especially for migrants and refugees and displaced persons in Australia and around the world.

Feast of St Mother Teresa of Calcutta- Albanian Community

On the 5th September, 2021, the Albanian Catholic Community came together to honour their patron Saint, Mother Teresa of Calcutta in a beautiful Mass held at Mater Christi Church at Seaton.

Beginning with a procession around the grounds of the Mater Christi Church, at midday; the community prayed the rosary together in the various languages - Albanian, Filipino, Italian and English. With only 10 percent of the Albanian population Catholic, there was a definite 'presence' as the Adelaide Albanian people gathered in reverence and respect for the 5th Feast Day of their Saint who exemplifies Christ's Love.

Father Roger Manalo CS, has been the priest celebrant of the Albanian Catholic Community for the last 5 years. He gave a beautiful homily acknowledging the strong patronage of the people and their willingness to "be love" wherever they find themselves in the world, just as Mother Teresa did.

The children of the community delighted in participating in the Procession of the Statue of St Mother Teresa and in the Mass. Reading the prayers of the faithful and participating in the procession of gifts; the children carried symbols to the sanctuary representing the life of Saint Mother Teresa, coordinated by Franceska.

Beatification of Cardinal Stefan Wyszynski and blind nun Mother Elzbieta Roza Czacka- Polish Community

A Polish cardinal persecuted by communist authorities during the Cold War and a nun dedicated to helping the blind took a step towards sainthood last month when they were beatified at the Temple of Divine Providence in Warsaw.

The beatification was cause for celebration amongst the Polish community at the Resurrection Church, Unley, where Polish chaplain Fr Michal Skiba SCHR for three days celebrated Mass with homilies dedicated to Cardinal Stefan Wyszynski and Mother Elzbieta Roza Czacka.

Fr Skiba also organised a concert on September 11, with music, songs, poems and short movies dedicated to the two Blesseds.

All four days of the spiritual preparation for the beatification were well attended by members of the Polish community.

Cardinal Wyszynski, the primate of Poland from 1948 to 1981, is attributed with saving the faith of Poles in the harsh days of communism.





Italian Festa - La Madonna di Montevergine

It has been 66 years since the first Festa in honour of "La Madonna Di Montevergine" back in 1955 at St Francis of Assisi Church, Newton but the devotion and enthusiasm is still very strong as has been shown by everyone that attended this year's celebrations in particular the youth in our community, considering the pandemic that we're all living through. This year's Mass Celebration was presided over by our Parish Priest Fr Eldridge D'Souza. A young and dynamic Priest that has embraced the Italian culture.

Under a COVID management plan, the SA Government allowed 2500 people to attend this event. The community responded patiently as Covid Marshals monitored and staggered entry so that more than 4500 people were able to enjoy this special celebration over the course of the day.

A great big thank you to everyone that took part in organising this great manifestation of faith and also volunteered throughout the day in the various stalls selling traditional Italian foods including the famous "Zeppole" that are a big part of this tradition, a tradition which hopefully will carry on long into the future.

We know many of you followed the week through the various podcasts, as well as tuning in to the live streams. We hope it gave you a flavour of the main themes arising from the discernment process. There were no decisions called upon at this session, however recommendations came forward from the small groups for further work over the next nine months before the final session of the Plenary Council next year. Our hope and prayer is that firm decisions will be made in the final session in 2022.

Passage of the South Australian Multicultural Bill 2020

On 14 October 2021, the landmark South Australian Multicultural Bill 2020 passed both Houses of Parliament and will soon become law.

This historically significant occurrence fulfils the Government's aim of providing new legislation that reflects the needs of our multicultural state today and sets a foundation for modern policy directions.

Developed following the 2019 review of the South Australian Multicultural and Ethnic Affairs Commission Act 1980, the state's sole piece of multicultural legislation, the South Australian Multicultural Bill will replace the SAMEAC Act.

The Bill reflects the feedback received during the review consultation, which strongly supported the need for us to expand our thinking on multiculturalism. To this end, the concept of interculturalism has been incorporated into the legislation as being inclusive, contemporary, and encouraging greater collaboration and the exchange of information and ideas between all sectors of our diverse community.

The centrepiece of the new legislation is the South Australian Multicultural Charter, which will be developed following the passage of the legislation. The Charter will be a set of principles defining what multiculturalism and interculturalism mean to all South Australians. The development of the Charter will be led by the South Australian Multicultural Commission, which is charged with the responsibility of leading community consultations as a vital part of this process.

We look forward to working with you and your community to progress the future development of exciting new multicultural policy for our great State.
