> WHY HAVE IT?: Celebrating their own Liturgy of the Word offers children an opportunity to build a relationship with Jesus and to encounter God. They discover for themselves the riches found in the scriptures through various ways of interacting with the story and form the link between scripture and worship.

the Word tailored to their age and stage of development is a key way of assisting their growth in faith and its relevance for Christian living. By offering liturgy that is relevant and engaging, we are leading children into a genuine sense of celebration which they will enjoy and want to be part of. These positive experiences will over time, build up and nurture a healthy relationship between the liturgy and their daily living which will in time, instil a desire within them to become active members in an adult worshipping community.



KEY PRINCIPLES

- It must be liturgy, prayer focussed not an activity session or religious education
- All good principles of liturgy apply ie: active participation, symbols, appropriate gestures and responses, scripture
- It is an experience of prayer, of dialogue with God
- It is not a child minding session
- It is ritual centred on proclaiming and breaking open the scriptures from the New Testament to help grow the relationship with Jesus
- It is a parallel to what occurs in most of the adult's Liturgy of the Word, aimed at the children's level of understanding
- The children's lectionary is used and revered
- Only the adult leader carries the lectionary and reads the scripture, not the children
- The children re-join the adult congregation before the Liturgy of the Eucharist begins
- It caters for primary school aged children (5-12 years)

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD LEADER TRAINING SESSION

Our office offers a 2 hour training session that is required before anyone can lead a session in their parish. The session is divided into two distinct parts. The first part offers a basic theology by way of background as to why we offer children's Liturgy of the Word and then the group is taken through a practical session where they participate as the children would. The second part unpacks the method of using 'Godly Play' as another way of breaking open the Word of God for children. All who attend get the chance to learn by doing, have fun in the process and receive a certificate of completion. BREAKING OPEN THE PARABLES

"I will open my mouth in parables, I will utter what has been hidden since the foundation of the world." (Matthew 13:35) A parable is a comparison of two things, often done through a story that has two meanings. Parables stimulate the experience of unlikely thought. They encourage an irony that pushes language to its limits. They turn the world of the everyday upside down and ask us to begin again to make sense of life without the conventional cultural limits, making the meaning not so obvious. Jesus Christ did much of his teaching in parables deliberately to hold an audience's attention while illustrating an important moral point.

Parable of the Lost Sheep: Luke 15:1-7

Possible Teaching Points:

- God cares for each person, so we should do the same
- * We all matter to God
- No one is more or less important than the other
- Jesus is the Good Shepherd and cares for us like a shepherd cares for his sheep
- Ask the children if they have ever been lost
- What did it feel like?
- What did it feel like to be found?
- Play Follow The Leader
- Draw Jesus the shepherd

Parable of the lost Son: Luke 15: 11-32

Possible Teaching Points:

- God forgives us and we should forgive each other
- God is like a loving Father and happy when we come to Him
- God is approachable, caring and interested in each of us
- Ask the children if they like parties and what their favourite party food is
- Brainstorm what is good fun about being at a party
- Share a tasty treat. Compare this to eating eggshells. Discuss their response if they were very hungry
- Create a colourful poster about Forgiveness

Parable of the Good Samaritan: Luke 10: 25-37

Possible Teaching points:

- God is pleased when we show kindness to others
- A neighbour does not just live next door, we should be kind to anyone we meet
- The Spirit will help us do what is right
- Discuss with the children if they have ever asked an adult a cheeky question
- Describe a time when you have helped someone
- What did it feel like?
- Create a short drama about showing kindness
- Write a prayer about love

What next for families—after Children's Liturgy of the Word?

Some ideas:

- Listen to what your child/ren has/have experienced?
- Share: what message did you hear today? What would you like to do with what you heard today? Would you like to write, draw or pray?
- Pray together as a family
- Parent/s reflect on the scripture passage. Share or spend some quiet time together as a family
- Share what can be done as a family to live out what has been experienced

Short Digital Video Resources of the Parables for the Family

The Parable of the Lost Sheep: (Luke chapter 15 verses 11 to 32) This video illustrates Jesus' parable of the *Lost Sheep* without any language elements. The video explores the emotions of losing a prized possession and the joyous emotion when that possession is found.

The Parable of the Lost Son: (Matthew chapter 18 verses 10 to 14 and Luke chapter 15 verses 1 to 7) There are two parts to this parable. The Part 1 video follows the choices of the youngest son. Part 2 video follows the oldest son's response. There is a longer 7 minute version with animation only or a 2 minute version with narration.

The Parable of the Good Samaritan: (Luke chapter 10 verses 25-30) This is a narrated version which lasts only a couple of minutes.

The Parable of the Sower: (Matthew chapter 13 verses 1 to 23; Mark chapter 4 verses 1 to 20 or Luke chapter 8 verses 1 to 15) In animation only, this video illustrates clearly the 4 instances of the seeds scattered on different ground. Experience the seeds growing and the challenges they face. How will you respond to Jesus' message?

On this website, there is also a **book of Scripture puzzles** for the family to do which can be downloaded as well as other 60 minute videos. Choose the appropriate ones.
