MIGRANT AND REFUGEE SUNDAY 2023

The Archdiocese of Adelaide celebrated the 109th World Day of Migrants and Refugees with Holy Mass at St Francis Xavier Cathedral at 2.30pm, on Sunday 24 September 2023. This annual multicultural mass is a feature on the diocesan calendar drawing more than 250 people from parishes and communities across Adelaide to come together to the Eucharistic Table celebrating the unique fabric of our multicultural church.

The theme chosen by Pope Francis for the celebration this year is "Free to Migrate or to Stay". Pope Francis imploring "We are called to show respect for the dignity of each migrant. And recognise that whatever place we decide to build our future, whether it be our country of birth or elsewhere, the important thing is that there always be a community ready to welcome, protect, promote and integrate everyone, without distinctions and without excluding anyone."

Father Dean Marin, Vicar General, began the Mass welcoming everyone – especially those that have come from distant lands. He also gave a warm welcome to our missionary clergy, expressing much gratitude as he acknowledged their selfless vocation to minister to us here in Australia. Monsignor Minh-Tam Nguyen from Vietnam, Father Michael Kyumu from Kenya; Father Laszlo Horvath OFM from Hungaria; Father Selva Leenaiah and Father Santhosh Nazareth CSC from India; Father Pastor Mumburi CP from Tanzania; Father Angelo Cagna CS, from Italy, Father Tomas Ruiz CS from Mexico; were all recognized and appreciated for their ministry here in Australia. Father Dean reminded us that God's love is infinite and immeasurable and we need only to trust it.

The Cathedral was full of joy, with choirs from Africa, Vietnam, China and Indian (Tamil Nadu) – uplifting the liturgy with such gusto and vibrancy!

The church was full of people young and old, from many cultures; some who migrated recently and other who migrated more than 60 years ago! Many in national costumes, representing their culture and faith they brought to Adelaide making up our diverse multicultural church.

The Readings were beautifully read in Sri Lankan and Konkani; with the universal prayers read in Vietnamese, Albanian, Korean, Slovenian, Spanish and Indonesian.

A highlight was at the Lord's Prayer, where Father Dean invited the congregation to pray this familiar prayer in our mother tongue, in unison! What might have been chaotic instead was a beautiful moment of unity in diversity! Concluding the Mass with prayer from Pope Francis' for migrants and refugees; a prayer of hope where all people live in peace and harmony wherever they may be.

After the Mass, coffee and icecream awaited !!– lots of smiles were abound and God's sun shined on all. There was a such joy on the lawns with each person inspired by our differences but united in our faith and love.











THE FEAST OF VALAINKANNI 2023 - OUR LADY OF GOOD HEALTH

The Feast of Vailankanni was celebrated by the Indian community on 10th September 2023 at Annunciation Church, Hectorville. This celebration was organised by the Adelaide Tamil Catholic Community (ATCC) supported by Fr Anthoni Adimai, the Chaplain to the Tamil Community. The flag hoisting Mass was held on Friday, September 1, 2023, followed by the Rosary. Nine consecutive days of novenas were held in various houses. Father Anthoni sincerely thanked the families that hosted these prayer evenings and those who joined this prayerful worship as the statue of Our Lady of Vailankanni travelled from family to family during this time of the Novena.

On Sunday September 10th, 2023, at 2.30 p.m., the celebration commenced with a procession of the statue of Our Lady of Vailankanni on the St Joseph's school oval.

The Feast day was attended by more than 200 faithful. The rosary was recited in Hindi, Tamil, English, Konkani and Malayalam, and the statue was processed into the church.

The mass began with the traditional Aarathi – with the altar prepared with much love and care - with flowers, lights and decorations. The choir was exquisite showing the tamil music and the talent of the various parishioners.

The main celebrant was Father Matthew Newman, who humbly was joined by eight Indian Priests. The homily centred around Mary, her birth and devotion and the beautiful faith the Indian community has brought to Adelaide particularly Hectorville this day. Father Mathew also took the opportunity to thank the missionary priests for their faith, their courage, and their strength in a sometimes challenging climate (when ministering abroad)— the people responded with spontaneous applause which showed that his words had touched the grateful hearts of our faithful here in Adelaide.

At the end of the Mass, the flag was lowered and everyone was invited for fellowship and hospitality after the Mass.







THE FEAST OF ST MOTHER TERESA OF CALCUTTA 2023



On the 10th September, 2023, the Albanian Catholic Community came together to honour their patron Saint, Mother Teresa of Calcutta in a beautiful Mass held at Mater Christi Church at Seaton celebrated by Archbishop Patrick O'Regan DD and concelebrated by Father Tomas Ruiz CS, PP of Seaton, and Father Angelo Cagna CS, Italian Chaplain to the Seaton Community.

Beginning with a procession around the grounds of the Mater Christi Church; the community prayed the rosary together in Albanian, Italian and English.

This was a very special day – as two great women were remembered, revered and prayed for – St Mother Teresa of Calcutta – deeply loved by the community for her care for the poor

The Franciscan Sisters of St Anthony – who serve in the Seaton Parish, were celebrating another step in the beatification of their foundress: Mother Miradio of the Providence of St Gaetano!

During the Homily, Archbishop Patrick O'Regan read out the decree for Mother Miradio, endorsed by Pope Francis. This was a very proud and awaited occasion for the Franciscan Sister of St Anthony who have been in Adelaide serving since the late 90's, invited to minister Pasotral Care at our Aged Care Facilities. Their Pastoral care work extends to the physical, emotional, recreational, cultural and spiritual needs of the care recipients as well as providing assistance and support to their families.

It is obvious these two women and their legacy of sisters live out the mission of Jesus in a very real way.

Statue of St Mother Teresa and in the Mass erected by the Albanian Community, supported by the Mater Christi church was unveiled in 2018. It was an event that united the many different cultural communities that celebrate Mass at Mater Christi every weekend.

Parish Priest, Father Tomas, praised the community the sisters and the Albanian Community showing the deep love he has for all his people, as the Albanian Community shared this feast and their joy with the Franciscan Sisters of St Anthony – Sr Quintillia, Sr Judith, Sr Dora and Sr Philomena were all present and participated in a blessing along with the Archbishop of their foundress.

After the Mass the people enjoyed a meal together, and watched the amazing Albanian Dance School performance.

10TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE MYANMAR CATHOLIC COMMUNITY

Father Dean's homily invited us to be "witnesses of the living faith" and "promote and pray for peace" as we attempt to imitate Christ in all that we do.

Four young people were baptised, and one young man was Confirmed, completing the sacraments of initiation by receiving Holy Communion for the first time.
