Father Brian Lucas is a priest of the Archdiocese of Sydney ordained in 1980. He has held parish appointments and was Archdiocesan Secretary (1990 – 2002) and General Secretary of the Australian Ca

and General Secretary of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (2002 – 2015). He is currently the National Director of Catholic Mission and a member of the finance council of the Pontifical Mission Societies. For 20 years he authored the question answer column in the Catholic Weekly. He is a co-author of The Church Administration Handbook and author of Pleasing to God: The Call to Church Administration and Collaborators in Ministry: A Guide for Lay People and Clergy
