# **SERVICE TO OTHERS**

### Love Your Neighbour as yourself (Matthew 22:39)

Service to others is the foundation to the life and message of Jesus. Because he came 'to serve' and 'to give'. The Christian life is one of service to others, where we show love and kindness to others, including those who do not treat us well. We can serve others in various ways and we should make the most of every opportunity that comes our way. One of the most beneficial ways to serve others is to show them that we care. Giving our time and support to someone will often be more appreciated than even the most beautiful gift. When others need our help most, we should make a special effort to show them that they matter. By providing love and understanding we can make a real difference in the lives of others. Paul has reminded us that helping others when they are struggling is central to the gospel.

Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. (Galatians6:2)

Telling others of the good news of Jesus is the best example of how informing and educating others can help people alter their lives. Letting others know about our own experiences, in a sincere and loving manner, can help people to discover the truth of the Christian gospel and experience it for themselves.

Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age. (Matthew 28:19)

## CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

Pope Francis says; "Today we need a Church capable of walking at people's side, of doing more than simply listening to them; a Church which accompanies them on their journey." (Rio de Janeiro, World Youth Day, 2013) The Church gives us the foundation for our thinking and acting in peace and justice. It is called catholic Social Teaching and it teaches us that:

- All people are created in the image of God
- All life is interconnected
- All people are called to work towards a peaceful and just society
- Money, business and work exist to serve people
- All people have a basic right to life, food, housing, health care, education and work
- ♦ All people are called to serve others especially the marginalised



This catholic social teaching lies right at the heart of the St Vincent de Paul Society. This society was founded by 20 year old Frederic Ozanam in 1833. It was established by like minded people who wished to put their faith into action. This compassionate outlook, enthusiasm and vision strongly continues today in Australia. There are thousands of people who share their time and their care for humanity to make a real difference in the lives of the many disadvantaged people living in Australia. Operating since 1884, the Society in South Australia has over 3500 members and volunteers in 63 Conferences, 34 Vinnies Centres and numerous Special Works. They work together with dedicated staff to provide immediate relief to those in need and work together to identify the deep and long-term causes leading to spiritual, financial and social hardship in our community, and become a voice for the disadvantaged. The Society is supported by the generosity of individuals, churches, schools, numerous groups and volunteers to continue to serve.





# THE SAINTS

Saints are an important part of being catholic. A saint gives witness to what it means to be a true disciple of Jesus, is an example of holiness and keeps on trying no matter the cost. She/ he is an ordinary person who took up God's call with faith and love and dedication and touches the inner lives of others in ways that transform them for the better. A saint is always someone through whose life we learn what God is like - and of what we are called to be. Only God 'makes' saints.

Qualities of a Saint: an excellent role model; unusually good at teaching people to live lives of goodness; act as channels of God's grace; intercessor; generous, unselfish behaviour; and have a special relation to all that is holy so that they are able to interpret God and holiness for others. A saint challenges us to seek new ways of discipleship in response to our own context. They remind us of the possibility of God's work in us.

one God, for ever and ever. AMEN



### CHILDREN'S LITURGY of the WORD

Regular training is an important aspect to Children's Liturgy of the World (CLOW) and the Salisbury Catholic Parish runs CLOW in 3 Mass Centres, over 5 Masses during a weekend with roughly 100 school aged children on their faith journey attending each weekend. Our leaders break open God's Word for the children at age appropriate level.
