Preparing the prayer space


Place a green cloth on the table or floor (green – the colour for Ordinary Time)

Place a cross, bible and candle on it. Light the candle or use a battery-operated candle for safety. Add any other symbols relevant to your family.

- Suggested activities: your choice or other related activity on sheet
- Print out sheet if required

Parent/Caregiver: In today's gospel, Jesus reminds us that the love we have for God should be reflected through our actions, thoughts and in the way we treat others.

Opening prayer:

Lord God, help us to love and honour you through the way that we treat others. Let us love and treat people with kindness and compassion. Amen.

Gospel: A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark (7:1-5, 14-16, 21-23)

All: Glory to you O, Lord.

Some Pharisees and several teachers of the Law of Moses from Jerusalem came and gathered around Jesus. They noticed that some of his disciples ate without first washing their hands.

The Pharisees and all other Jewish people obey the teachings of their ancestors. They always wash their hands in the proper way before eating. None of them will eat anything they buy in a market until it is washed. They also follow a lot of other teachings, such as washing cups, pitchers and bowls.

The Pharisees and teachers asked Jesus, "Why don't your disciples obey what our ancestors taught us to do? Why do they eat without washing their hands?"

Jesus called the crowd together again and said, "Pay attention and try to understand what I mean. The food that you put into your mouth does not make you unclean and unfit to worship God. The bad words that come out of your mouth are what make you unclean.

"Out of your heart come evil thoughts, vulgar deeds, stealing, murder, unfaithfulness in marriage, greed, meanness, deceit, indecency, envy, insults, pride, and foolishness. All these come from your heart, and they are what make you unfit to worship God."

Scripture reflection and time of sharing:

I wonder how Jesus was feeling when the Pharisees spoke to him...

Intercessions: Let us now spend some time in prayer asking God to listen to our needs. *(We respond to the prayers by saying the words 'Lord, hear our prayer')*

1 We pray for Pope Francis, Archbishop Patrick O'Regan, all Church and world leaders: that they will lead with wisdom and right judgement. Lord, hear us. **All:** Lord, hear our prayer

2 We pray for those who are in the process of receiving the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. That the Holy Spirit will strengthen them in their faith and relationship with God.

Lord, hear us. All: Lord, hear our prayer

3 We pray for the members of our Church who live in countries where they cannot freely live out their faith. May they find peace and strength in God. Lord, hear us. **All:** Lord, hear our prayer

We pause for a moment and pray in our hearts or aloud for any intentions or people we would like to pray for at this time *(pause)* Lord, hear us. **All:** Lord, hear our prayer

6 We pray for those who are sick or have experienced hurt and loss. May they find comfort and strength in Jesus.

Lord, hear us. All: Lord, hear our prayer

Closing prayer: We lift up our hearts and the prayers of our community. We make these prayers through Christ, our Lord. Amen.
