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THE CALL TO EVANGELISATION

WE ARE ALL CALLED TO EVANGELISE

We hear this at the end of each Celebration of the Eucharist when the celebrant proclaims one of the following:

Go forth, the Mass is ended.

Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord.

Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.

Go in peace.

And in response the people proclaim in one voice: Thanks be to God.

As a community, we are sent forth with a commission; and to this we respond with these sentiments:

'Yes, we will go in God's name. Thanks be to God we can and will do this'!



WE ARE SENT FORTH TO EVANGELISE

(From the Australian Bishops Commission for Evangelisation website)

"For the Church, evangelising means bringing the Good News into all the strata of humanity, and through its influence transforming humanity from within and making it new: "Now I am making the whole of creation new." [Rev. 21:5; cf. 2 Cor 5:17; Gal 6:15.]

But there is no new humanity if there are not first of all new persons renewed by Baptism [cf Rom 6:4] and by lives lived according to the Gospel. [Cf. Eph 4:24-25; Col 3:9-10.]

The purpose of evangelisation is therefore precisely this interior change, and if it had to be expressed in one sentence the best way of stating it would be to say that the Church evangelises when she seeks to convert, [Cf. Rom 1:16; 1 Cor 1:18, 2:4.] solely through the divine power of the message she proclaims, both the personal and collective consciences of people, the activities in which they engage, and the lives and concrete milieu which are theirs."

(Pope Paul VI, Evangelii Nuntiandi, n18)



- A How can I make a difference?


Reflecting upon our own ongoing faith formation, may assist us in fine-tuning....

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL PARENTS/CAREGIVERS

At the beginning of the Sacrament program, we recommend parishes present information to parents/ caregivers regarding the directives from the Archbishop regarding **Sponsors for Confirmation candidates.** Please do not assume that this is general knowledge.

'There is only to be one sponsor.

The minimum requirement for a sponsor is that he or she be over 16 and a Catholic who has been confirmed and received Holy Communion. Parish Priests and those who share in the ministry of preparation are to ensure that this is observed.

The role of the sponsor is two-fold:

- 1 to testify to the readiness of the candidate to receive the Sacrament; and
- To help the newly confirmed lead a Christian life and fulfil the obligations connected with it. It is not simply an honour conferred by the candidates and their families, but an office undertaken on behalf of the Christian community. Canon Law (c.874) states that sponsors should "lead a life in harmony with the faith and the role to be undertaken".

The second requirement is more difficult to assess and implement, but it should be clearly communicated to all concerned. At the very least sponsors should try to participate, as far as possible, in preparation programmes.'

This information is contained in the Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide 2021 Sacrament of Confirmation Guidelines for Ceremonies sent to parishes on behalf of the Archbishop.

These Guidelines contain other directives regarding Liturgy, Lectors (Readers) at Mass and the Running Outline for the Ceremony. Directives regarding Photographs and Certificates are found on the 2021 Sacrament of Confirmation Ceremony Summary Form also sent to parishes through the Archbishop's Office



As first nurturers and educators of the faith of our children, parents/caregivers are invited to explore ways which may assist.


LIVING THE GOSPELS IN DAILY LIFE

Jesus told the story of a father who longed for the return of his son.

You can find this story in the gospel of Luke (Luke 15:1-32) or on Youtube

This story is often called the story of the Prodigal Son.

It can have other names such as: the Two Lost Sons, The Forgiving Father, The Loving Father.



Suggested Activity

- Explore freebibleimages.com
- Find other pictures which make up this story
- Create a story board.

What do you think is happening? It could be from the characters' perspectives.

I wonder...

What happened next? Where the other people were? What they were thinking?










CATECHIST REFLECTION

Taking inspiration from the prayer style of Visio Divina, take time to pray with the beautiful painting by Rembrant on The Return of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32).



1. PREPARE

Begin with the Sign of the Cross. You may like to begin by using a simple breath prayer or read through the relevant scripture.

2. GAZE

Take time to look deeply at the image. What do you notice? What do you wonder?

3. PONDER

What stood out as you gazed upon the image?
What do you feel that God is stirring in you or communicating to you?

4. PRAY & CLOSE


Bring your thoughts and feelings to prayer. You may like to record these things into your journal, or offer up what came up as you pondered. You may like to end your prayer with the Glory Be.


