Preparing the prayer space

Place a green cloth on the table or floor (green – the colour for Ordinary Time)

Place a cross, bible, and candle on it. Light the candle or use a battery-operated candle for safety. Add any other symbols relevant to your family.

- Suggested activities: your choice or other related activity on sheet
- Print out sheet if required

Parent/Caregiver: In today's gospel, Jesus talks about how important children are. Jesus invites the children to come to him and blesses them.

Opening prayer:

Lord God, help us to be like Jesus and see that each person is important no matter what. Help us to be loving and welcoming towards all people.

Gospel: A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark (10:13-16)

All: Glory to you O, Lord.

Some people brought their children to Jesus so that he could bless them by placing his hands on them. But his disciples told the people to stop bothering him.

When Jesus saw this, he became angry and said, "Let the children come to me! Don't try to stop them. People who are like these little children belong to the kingdom of God. I promise you that you cannot get into God's kingdom, unless you accept it the way a child does."

Then Jesus took the children in his arms and blessed them by placing his hands on them.

Scripture reflection and time of sharing:

I wonder what your favourite part of the gospel was...

I wonder how the disciples were feeling after seeing Jesus bless the children... I wonder how we can be a blessing towards others...

Intercessions: Let us now spend some time in prayer asking God to listen to our needs. (We respond to the prayers by saying the words 'Lord, hear our prayer')

Lord, hear us. All: Lord, hear our prayer

We pray that families will continue to grow in unity and to love and care for one another. Lord, hear us. **All:** Lord, hear our prayer

We pray that the members of our Church will give witness to God's love. Lord, hear us. **All:** Lord, hear our prayer

We pause for a moment and pray in our hearts or aloud for any intentions or people we would like to pray for at this time (*pause*)

Lord, hear us. All: Lord, hear our prayer

We pray for those who feel lost, have lost hope, and need healing, that they will find Jesus who calls them to come to him.

Lord, hear us. All: Lord, hear our prayer
