Gather around the prayer space as a family

Parent/Caregiver: In today's gospel, Jesus heals a blind man who was also a beggar, by the name of Bartimaeus.

Opening prayer:

Lord God, you desire for us to come to you, and you welcome us with open arms. Let us remember that you are always there for us in our times of need.

Gospel: A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark (10:46-52)

All: Glory to you O, Lord.

Jesus and his disciples went to Jericho. And as they were leaving, they were followed by a large crowd.

A blind beggar by the name of Bartimaeus son of Timaeus was sitting beside the road. When he heard that it was Jesus from Nazareth, he shouted, "Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me!"

Many people told the man to stop, but he shouted even louder, "Son of David, have pity on me!"

Jesus stopped and said, "Call him over!"

They called out to the blind man and said, "Don't be afraid! Come on! He is calling for you."

The man threw off this coat as he jumped up and ran to Jesus. Jesus asked, "What do you want me to do for you?"

The blind man answered, "Master, I want to see!"

Jesus told him, "You may go. Your eyes are healed because of your faith." Right away the man could see, and he went down the road with Jesus.

Intercessions: Let us now spend some time in prayer asking God to listen to our needs. (We respond to the prayers by saying the words 'Lord, hear our prayer')

Lord, hear us. All: Lord, hear our prayer

We pause for a moment and pray in our hearts or aloud for any intentions or people we would like to pray for at this time (pause)

Lord, hear us. All: Lord, hear our prayer

We pray for all who have died or who have lost loved ones. May the love of God comfort them in their time of need.

Lord, hear us. All: Lord, hear our prayer
