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THE CATECHIST'S ROLE

We have responded to the needs of your parish in taking on this important ministry. Our role as а catechist sees us called to be an 'echoer of Christ.' Jesus gathered a diverse group of his followers around him. He also gave them a commission and a promise that extends to each of us today. Jesus has commissioned each of us to go forth and teach in his name and has given each of us the gift of the Holy Spirit in Baptism, sealed us with the gifts at Confirmation and nourishes us in the Eucharist. Jesus has called us to be his witness to the children and their families with whom we work with. Therefore, as catechists we have acted on Jesus' calling because we show these qualities and skills:

- A personal commitment to Jesus Christ, who is at the centre of the message
- A commitment to the Church's liturgical and sacramental life and moral teachings
- A strong awareness of God's presence and a growing faith in response to that grace
- Be in a love story with God
- An openness to grow in our own awareness to better meet the needs of the children in our work
- Effective communication and teaching techniques

- An ability to appreciate different types and stages of individual growth and development in children
- Have a generosity of spirit, a respect for diversity and a habit of hospitality and inclusion of all

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- A willingness and openness to continue their own religious formation
- To be prepared to invite children and their families to a way of living
- An acceptance that there is room to learn how to be better able to 'echo Christ'
- An active prayer life


WHAT IS CATECHESIS?

'Catechesis' comes from the Greek 'katechein' which means 'sounding down', a 're-sounding', a 're-echoing down to one another'. So, in catechesis we echo 2,000 years of lived experience of Christ among us in the Church. It is the process of nurturing and maturing faith. It is ongoing, formative and outreaching.

All of these elements in a session lead to a dynamic, interactive encounter with Christ who speaks to us in the scriptures, brings us wisdom from the tradition, whose presence is celebrated in liturgy and who walks with us in our human experience.

The goal of catechesis is to put people in touch, in communion and in an intimate relationship with Christ. The object of catechesis is to lead people to profess their faith in Christ. Catechesis means that we are on a continuous journey of faith and a wanting to deepen our relationship with Christ through our experiences and encounters.

At times catechists become anxious about the content they should be presenting. The main point to know is that the key living source for any catechesis is the Word of God found in scripture. Catechists enable an encounter to occur between those who hear the Word and God and guide them to respond to the action of God.

Social Justice Sunday - The Gift of Family in Difficult Times: Sunday 30 September 2012 The Australian Catholic Social Justice Council (ACSJC) is preparing for the launch in September of the Australian Catholic Bishops' Social Justice Statement for 2012–2013, which is entitled, 'The Gift of Family in Difficult Times: The social and economic challenges facing families today'. In this year's Statement, the Catholic Bishops of Australia highlight how families, the basis of our community of faith and the very foundation of society, can be beacons for a more compassionate and just society. Many families in Australia find themselves under financial pressure or robbed of time to nurture children and family relationships. And in the broader context of our nation's prosperity, there are families, refugees, those on welfare support or struggling on minimum wages, the homeless, and those with special needs. The Statement highlights the social and economic pressures faced by families today and calls for policies which are supportive of all families, especially those who are most vulnerable. The ACSJC is


Resources

CATHOLIC RESOURCE & INFORMATION SERVICE

This is an invitation to use the professional services offered at CRIS. CRIS supports the mission of parishes, schools and other church agencies in their pastoral outreach as communities of faith. Membership is **open to all** and is **free** for all individual Catholics, Catholic schools and parishes. Resources available include books, journals, DVD's, CDs, reference material, picture books, big books, posters, and on-line information. Resources are available in the areas of: contemporary religious education, liturgical and sacramental practice, scripture and theology, adult faith formation, pastoral care, contemporary issues and the needs of the Catholic community and wider community. Loan periods for audio visual material is 2 weeks, and for print material 4 weeks. Metropolitan borrowers are responsible for the collection and return of their loans and those requiring a courier are financially responsible. For country borrowers CRIS will pay for postage to borrowers but then borrowers are responsible for the return postage. **Opening hours are Monday–Friday 9:00am-5:00pm. located at 112 Kintore Street, Thebarton. On the 16th August 2012 a Catechist meeting was held at the Para Hills/Modbury Parish at the Holy Trinity church. I sent out invitations and also placed an advertisement in the parish Bulletin but due to the cold, wet, dramatic weather only three catechists and I were able to make it. Never the less, both our workshop leaders Carmen Balales and Val DeBrenni from the Office for Family and Parish Based Catechesis were courageous enough to front the stormy weather and gave us an excellent overview of the topic of Leading Sunday Liturgy of the Word with children. This session was very important as it allowed for our volunteer ministers to have an understanding of how to lead a session of Liturgy for children. Carmen walked us



through the process and gave us a work booklet that included the power point presentation, the current diocesan Liturgy of the Word with Children at Sunday Mass principles plus a list of suggested resources available. A very useful resource for us to have! Val showed us how to present the Gospel to children by using

the method of Godly play. Useful tips and the steps of the process were also in the booklet given to us. We had a demonstration and then we were able to have a go ourselves. Positive response was received from those present and it provided us with an opportunity that evening to talk about our experiences as well as look at various resources available from CRIS over a cup of tea or coffee.
