

Gather around the prayer space as a family

Parent/Caregiver: In today's gospel, we hear that Elizabeth's baby leaps with joy at the presence of Mary who is carrying the baby Jesus in her womb.

Opening prayer:

Loving God, help us to trust in your plans and to remember that you will always keep your promises.

Gospel: A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke (2:1-14)

All: Glory to you O, Lord.

Emperor Augustus gave orders for the names of all the people to be listed in record books. These first records were made when Quirinius was governor of Syria.

Everyone had to go to their own hometown to be listed. So Joseph had to leave Nazareth in Galilee and go to Bethlehem in Judea. Long ago Bethlehem had been King David's hometown, and Joseph went there because he was from David's family.

Mary was engaged to Joseph and travelled with him to Bethlehem. She was soon going to have a baby, and while they were there, she gave birth to her first-born son. She dressed him in baby clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

That night in the fields near Bethlehem some shepherds were guarding their sheep. All at once an angel came down to them from the Lord, and the brightness of the Lord's glory flashed around them.

The shepherds were frightened.

But the angel said, "Don't be afraid! I have good news for you, which will make everyone happy. This very day in King David's hometown a Saviour was born for you. He is Christ the Lord. You will know who he is, because you will find him dressed in baby clothes and lying in a manger."

Suddenly many other angels came down from heaven and joined in praising God. They said: "Praise God in heaven! Peace on earth to everyone who pleases God."

The gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Intercessions: Let us now spend some time in prayer asking God to listen to our needs.
(*We respond to the prayers by saying the words 'Lord, hear our prayer'*)

1 We pray Pope Francis, Archbishop Patrick O'Regan, all Church and world leaders will speak for the voiceless and powerless.

Lord, hear us. **All:** Lord, hear our prayer

2 We pray for all immigrants, refugees and the homeless to be welcomed.

Lord, hear us. **All:** Lord, hear our prayer

3 We pray for our Church to welcome all who come seeking shelter and love/

Lord, hear us. **All:** Lord, hear our prayer

4 We pause for a moment and pray in our hearts or aloud for any intentions or people we would like to pray for at this time (*pause*)

Lord, hear us. **All:** Lord, hear our prayer

6 We pray for those who are sick and suffering that they may receive the grace of healing and comfort.

Lord, hear us. **All:** Lord, hear our prayer
